Hello Everyone,

Miracles happen as long as you believe. The phone call came early last evening to report immediately to the Heart Institute as a heart was available. Today the miracle happened for us. A heroic family generously gave our Jimmy the gift of a heart. After more than two long years our wait is over. Jim is in ICU at the Ottawa Heart Institute and he is doing as well as can be expected after eight hours of surgery. Marah, Brett and Ellis are finally resting at home, knowing that Jim is being well cared for by a very experienced team of doctors and nurses.

Your generosity, your kindness and warm wishes over the last few years has helped us all so much as we struggled through this long and often lonely wait. Thank you to all of you for your prayers and good wishes.

85% of Ontario residents believe in organ donation; however, only about 25% have actually signed up. If you haven't signed up yet, get out your health card and go to: beadonor.ca. It will take less than 2 minutes to sign up. One donor can save up to 8 lives. The oldest donor on record was 94 years young.

Honoured guests, comrades, ladies and gentlemen,

Today is a celebration of the hard work by a large number of dedicated people who helped make Branch 638 the vibrant community it is today. We also celebrate those who although unable to volunteer gave us their continuous and heartfelt support.

We acknowledge our charter members without whom we wouldn't be here. I'm sure they could tell us a lot of interesting stories about the beginnings of this branch. I'm told that at one point they had a special lottery. Each month they would put the bills in a pile and the winning one would get paid that month. It was a difficult time, but they persevered. A lot of hours and effort went into keeping this branch afloat. Today, bills are paid a day or two after they are received. The amazing thing is, that this huge undertaking was accomplished solely by volunteers.

I would like to mention names of people who helped over the years, but I don't want to keep you here all afternoon. Also I know that if I mentioned names I would surely miss a deserving few. We are thankful for all their tireless work and support.

When elected president four years ago, I mentioned that paying off the mortgage early was one of my priorities. We paid it off 14 months early, and this was accomplished by the hard work of many branch and L.A. members and by members and their friends who attended our functions.

To all the people present and to those who couldn't be here, to all who worked so hard for Branch 638, so we could be here today, ***I thank you.***



Remarks by Comrade Ken Sorrenti

Thank you for this invitation to participate in your mortgage burning ceremony. I bring greetings from the senior elected officers and staff on Ontario Command.

I came across a meeting report dated July 20, 1989, from then Zone Commander Clive Morris. In attendance were Chairman George St. Aubin, Secretary/Treasurer Frank Wilson, Kanata Council Liaison Frank Berry, Deputy District G Commander Jim Margerum and approximately 50 interested legion members. This was the third meeting in a series of meetings dating back to 1987 when the idea to start a legion branch in Kanata was first proposed.

There were some interesting comments in that report. At a June 2, 1988, meeting, it was stated that the Campeau Corp. had donated a site for a legion building. However, sometime later, this offer was withdrawn. June 1989, Kanata city council agreed to sell the legion a site of 1.5 acres for \$1.00 with six conditions.

The City of Kanata straddled both Zone G5 and G6. George St. Aubin indicated that his preference would be for the Kanata legion to be in Zone G6. The new site is at the intersection of Hines Road and old Highway 17.

As of June 2, 1988, 24 applications for membership had been received. As of July 13, 1989, 44 bona fide applications had been received, approximately 100 transfers were awaiting the approval of the charter. Today, the branch has 279 members.

This is just the tip of the iceberg on the history of the Kanata Branch. Since then, the branch has become a cornerstone of the community, being there for our veterans, seniors and youth. Now, being mortgage free will allow the branch to continue with its success for many years to come and be a model for other branches.





Remarks by Comrade Garry Pond

I bring you greetings from District G Council members and all our other 62 branches in our great District G.

I would like to congratulate you all on this milestone in the history of Branch 638. I remember being posted to Ottawa, back in 1988 from Petawawa. I met and worked in the same office with George Pollock that year. I knew he was a very busy military guy. Like most of us, he was doing things in the community and for most military people, this is second nature. I had no idea he and his comrades were up to the creation of a Legion branch and low and behold all these years have gone by.

On behalf of my wife Linda and I, thank-you for the invitation to attend this wonderful occasion today.

Remarks by Comrade George Wood



Thank you for the invitation to attend this ceremony today. I bring you greetings from our Zone Commander, soon to be Deputy District Commander, Dave Cormier,

along with congratulations from all of Zone G6 Council.

It is great to see so many here today to celebrate this auspicious occasion. After all, it's not every day that a mortgage is paid off.

As you reach this significant milestone in the history of Branch 638, you should be very proud of your accomplishment. I understand that this mortgage was paid off well before the due date and that was only because of the hard work and dedication of your members.

I wish you well in all your future endeavours and am sure this branch will continue to bring credit to Zone G6.

Branch History by Comrade Ivan Hawley

I became involved with our mortgage situation in the mid-90s. At that time we had a first mortgage with Granville Savings and Loan of a little over \$300,000, a City of Kanata lien of a quarter of a million payable if we ever sold the property, a second mortgage with CIBC of close to \$80,000 and a third mortgage with PRITEC (the builder) of around \$35,000. We were able to make payments only on the first mortgage.

There was a fear that any morning there would be a foreclosure sign on the door and the locks changed. That was bad enough, but then the city began demanding payment of property taxes. Our first president decreed that Legions did not pay

property taxes, but the city did not see it that way.

With the threat of the property being seized for taxes owing, a small contingent (Frank Valentine, Harry Riley and Ivan Hawley) drove to Toronto to meet with the VP of Granville Savings and Loan.

Mr. Mendelson assured us that Granville had no intention of foreclosing on us. Further, the other mortgagers had no authority to foreclose. He asked how much we owed the City of Kanata (around \$24,000). He then advanced those funds, adding it to our mortgage. The happy trio headed home and consequently many Legion moveable objects stored in members' basements and garages returned to the branch.

We were still able to pay only the first mortgage about a year later when Granville advised us that they were getting out of the mortgage business and that they would need their money by the end of October. Our banker at the Royal Bank was keen to take it on, and we agreed, as we did all our business with them. The trouble was that he had no authority to write a commercial mortgage--the arrangements would have to be done downtown. I met with the rep. and all looked good. They needed some more info, which we supplied. Each week I checked on progress and the bank painted a rosy picture. First it was a few problems then down to a few Ts to cross--then nothing.

Time was running out, so I went to our local bank to meet with the mortgage rep. I was introduced to a three-foot wide lady sitting behind a four-foot deep desk. I asked what was going on and she said,

"Oh, we are not giving you a mortgage. Didn't anyone tell you?" After I picked up my jaw off the desk, she asked,

"What are you going to do now?" My first thought was to leap across that big desk and grab her by the throat--but I didn't.

Meanwhile, Canderell, who owns the Kanata North Business Park, had been courting us with the objective of turning our property into a grand entrance to the park. They would build a new

home for us behind Kelly's Funeral Home. Even the city was on side, but Canderell had signed nothing. They learned of our mortgage problem and offered to take it over. That way they were able to keep their options open. However, in the next two years the glow of high tech was gone, the new city said they would not pay for lighting at a new inter-section, etc. We were looking for a new mortgager.

The second and third mortgage holders agreed to accept 75 cents on the dollar, so we were looking for \$400,000. Harry had talked to a few local bankers and they were all keen, but none had the authority. The Royal assured us, it would be different this time. We made the application with the Ottawa office and I

gave them four days to respond--no pretending this time! By the end of the week they admitted that they would not give us a mortgage. Regardless of the debit equity ratio (it could be as low as 20:1) they did not wish to mortgage a service organization with no one individual to hold accountable, and a foreclosure would be terrible P.R.

I approached two local, Legion-friendly lenders, but their money was all tied up. The mortgage brokers were hesitant as that bleep bleep quarter million lien came before the extra \$100,000 on the mortgage we were asking for. I stumbled across Caisse Populaire, who said they would consider us. They wanted \$1,000 to do the investigation. With nowhere else to turn, we paid and prayed.

It worked. We persuaded the new city to drop the lien, and with Shawn Traversy getting us on the map for catering and hall rental, we never looked back.
