Our own Comrade Gerry Dore was awarded the Minister of Veterans Affairs Commendation on Friday the 10th of July by the Honourable Erin O'Toole.

Gerry has spent many years working for the betterment of veterans. Enclosed* is the statement as posted on the Minister of Veterans Affairs Site. Congratulations Comrade Gerry on a job well done. Mr. Dore is a Canadian Armed Forces Veteran. He has been a member of the Royal Canadian Legion for 48 years, serving as a member of the executive as well as service officer for a number of branches. Mr. Dore frequently drives Veterans to and from appointments and also volunteers with the RCL's Outreach and Visitation Initiative, visiting facilities to ensure that Veterans are receiving the appropriate level of care. After each visit, he forwards a summary of his findings to RCL Dominion Command and VAC, along with recommendations for a follow-up, if required. Mr. Dore is of Métis heritage, is a member of Aboriginal Veterans Autochtones and has assisted the First Nations organization in Rama, Ontario, researching its Veterans. He participates in its annual Veterans' Parade on November 11 and, for the past three vears, has been Head Veteran at the Rama Chippewa First Nation's annual Pow-Wow. Mr. Dore has also donated a P.O.W./M.I.A. flag and pole to the organization for its use in parades. In 2014, after attending Remembrance Day ceremonies at his local RCL branch, Mr. Dore organized a commemorative ceremony in the condominium building where he and many other Veterans reside. This was well received by several in attendance, including a 101-year-old Veteran, who would not have otherwise been able to attend a ceremony.

Last month saw the passing of a very dear friend of the Kanata Legion, Comrade Mel Newman. The following excerpt from his Life Membership submission is printed below.

Comrade Mel Newman was a cherished member of Branch 638 and our branch Chaplain since 1996. A veteran of the Second World War, Cde Mel served in the medical field stationed at a hospital in England where, he honed his ability to care for the sick and wounded. His true compassion among the wounded became apparent after the war ended. Cde Mel graduated in theology at the University of Saskatchewan and became a minister for the United Church of Canada. He served several congregations until retirement.

Cde Mel had served Branch 638 exceptionally well since becoming our Chaplain. His cheerful, caring, passionate demeanour was ever present and was always welcome where ever he traveled. He continued to be appreciably involved within our communities youth groups, clubs and agencies until the last few years, only because he could no longer get around. He always availed himself to visit the sick and homebound within our branch and community, regularly visiting our members in the many area retirement homes.

He actively participated in our Remembrance services for seniors groups and in the ceremony at the cenotaph on Remembrance Day. He was ever present to give blessings during dinners, officiated at a number of weddings for members and their families at the branch, and dependably took part at Legion tributes. Simply put, in addition to doing everything a chaplain is supposed to do, Cde Mel captured the hearts of everyone while doing it. Branch 638 was blessed to have him as a member and Chaplain.

The President, Executive and Members of Kanata Branch 638 took great pride in nominating Comrade Mel Newman for his award of Life Membership in the Royal Canadian Legion in recognition of his many years of loyal support for his parishioners, the Veterans of Canada and his dedication to this branch and community.

He will be missed. WE WILL REMEMBER HIM.
